Nothing Like a Dame is a celebration of the lives and careers of four of our most iconic actresses; Dame Eileen Atkins, Dame Judi Dench, Dame Joan Plowright and Dame Maggie Smith. All four have gone from being fledgling actresses in the 1950s to acting royalty and now you can hear their story.



The Passion of Joan of Arc (PG) 96mins

Dir: Carl Theodor Dreyer | 1928

Featuring live piano accompaniment from Darius Battiwala. 90 years on, this classic silent film tells the story of a doomed 15th-century teenage warrior. On trial for claiming she'd spoken to God, Jeanne d'Arc is subjected to inhumane treatment and scare tactics at the hands of church court officials. Her punishment, a famously brutal execution that earns her perpetual martyrdom.

The Old Dark House (PG) 72mins

Dir: James Whale | 1932

A new restoration of the chilling lost classic from the director of Frankenstein and The Invisible Man. Director James Whale turned J.B. Priestley's novel Benighted into a nerve-jangling tale that became the template for all spooky-house chillers to come. Stranded travellers stumble upon a strange old house and find themselves at the mercy of a highly eccentric and potentially dangerous family. Featuring an unforgettable horror role for Boris Karloff, as the hulking, disfigured butler Morgan.
